Macintosh Displays Single Raster Line

PROBLEM DESCRIPTION: The Macintosh displays a single white raster line. The line is usually positioned horizontally or vertically across the screen.

BEFORE YOU START: Familarize yourself with Macintosh Technical Procedures. ALWAYS DISCHARGE THE CRT TO THE "GROUND LUG". The Macintosh uses an isolated ground. Performing a discharge to the chassis will DESTROY the logic board!

CAUSE: In most cases this is an indication of a faulty Power Supply Board but there exists a possibility that more than one module is defective.

CURE: Replace the modules in the following order:

- Replace the power supply and test. If the system is still inoperative perform Step 2.
- Replace the Logic Board. If the system is still inoperative perform Step 3.
- 3. Replace the CRT. If the system is still inoperative perform Step 4.
- 4. Replace the Power Supply and the Logic board as a set.
