Check to see if the toolbox-specific device "/dev/uinter0" exists. The mode of toolbox-specific device should be: 4, 0 May 3 16:30 /dev/uinter0 crw-rw-rw-1 root sys If this device file is corrupted or has disappeared, here is how to recover: 1. Bring the system to the single-user mode.

- 2. In single-user mode, type the command
 # /etc/newunix toolbox
- 4. Type the commands:

- # sync
- # sync
- # sync

$7.\ \mbox{Reboot}$ with the command

reboot

This should not happen in A/UX 2.0 and beyond.
