TOPIC -----Currently, the Macintosh II one-button mouse is the only mouse device available under the A/UX X Window System. Although many X client applications are designed for a three-button mouse, the A/UX X Window System uses the keyboard cursor arrow keys to act as the middle and the right mouse buttons. Following are their equivalents: Three-button mouse device Macintosh II equivalents

"Mouse Left" or "Button 1" Actual Mouse Button	
"Mouse Middle" or "Button 2" Option Key	
"Mouse Right" or "Button 3" Enter Key	
"Meta Key" Command (Open Apple or Cloverleaf)	Кеу
