Revised: 12/4/89 Security: Everyone MacWorkStation 3.1: Interprets Semicolon as End of Command ______ This article last reviewed: 12 October 1989 Regarding MacWorkStation 3.1 (specifically version b6): I am sending a D010 with a dialog ID and item ID (for example, D010 209;3;), where item ID 3 is an editable text field, to get the text. However, my text contains some semicolons, which MacWorkStation uses as an end-of-line marker! How can I return all of the text, including all of the semicolons? DISCUSSION -----The only way you can send a semicolon and not have it interpreted as the end of a command is to have it enclosed within double quotes (";"). The MacWorkStation manual has the following example: "This string contains a semicolon;" The string you are sending must be the entire string parameter for that specific MacWorkStation command, although the command itself and any other
