TOPIC -----

How do you configure an A/UX box to use an existing Domain Name Server on the network?

DISCUSSION -----

The easiest way to make A/UX use an existing name server on the network, is to create a file called /etc/resolv.conf. The file should contain the domain you belong to and the IP address of the name server for that domain.

For example, the following lines would be the content of the /etc/resolv.conf file that points to the name server for the domain called testing.com:

domain testing.com nameserver 192.1.1.1

This says that the domain you belong to is called testing.com, and that the nameserver is located at 192.1.1.1.
