The Apple Macintosh PowerBook Duo 210 offers high performance in a 4-pound package that you can take anywhere and can become part of a complete desktop Macintosh system when you bring it back to your desk. It includes a CPU, full-size 16-gray-level supertwist display, keyboard and trackball, battery, and disk storage.

The PowerBook Duo 210 can be transformed into a desktop Macintosh by attaching it to an optional Duo Dock or MiniDock. You can then work with a large color display, full-size keyboard, printers, and network servers.
