Apple IIe Card: A/ROSE Causing Error Running IIe Startup (1/95)

TOPIC -----

Some customers launching the IIe Startup application are getting dialog to the effect "This card is defective." They may also be experiencing their IIe software "freezing" either while in use or after sitting idle. This can happen on any Macintosh computer that supports the Apple IIe Card.

This can also happen if you install an Apple Ethernet Card in certain Macintosh computers, and then later remove it and install in its place an Apple IIe Card. You may also encounter occasional crashes after approximately 30 minutes of idle time.

DISCUSSION -----

To correct this problem, delete the A/Rose and IIe Prefs files then restart. A/Rose is located in the Extensions Folder and IIe Prefs is located in the same folder as the IIe Startup application.
