This article describes the release notes for SNA•ps 3270 1.1.1.

DISCUSSION -----

Fixed in Previous Release (v1.1)

-----

- A read buffer problem was fixed. This bug caused bad data to be sent to the host when requesting color attributes. If this data was then sent back to SNA•ps 3270 by the host, SNA•ps 3270 would give a negative response.
- ASCII translation tables were being released before text file transfer completed when multiple file transfers were taking place at the same time. This caused garbage data to appear in the file that finished the transfer last.

Fixed in This Release (v1.1.1)

-----

- An alert was added to handle a new gateway error received when too many clients are connected to a gateway.
- A simple security mechanism was added. If the security resource is removed from the application file, then the user cannot change the default connection or select a new connection for a document. An administrator must supply a preferences file with a default connection or a document with the appropriate connection already selected.
- A problem with an improper positive response to a bind was fixed.
- Resources were added for new Norsis keyboard.

- The ability to type-ahead was added. After an AID key is entered, SNA•ps 3270 will still accept keystrokes even if input is inhibited.
- Keystroke handling in numeric fields was changed to accept comma and dup keys.
- A pop-up menu in the connection dialog now allows model type selection for SNA•ps Gateway connections. This feature only works if the dynamic log mode feature of VTAM is turned on (this feature first binds, then queries the terminal for desired screen size, then unbinds and rebinds with the desired screen size). If it is not turned on, selecting a specific model has no effect.
- Printing speed was improved for system 7.0. When printing, SNA•ps 3270 first checks to see if the Noiro font is installed. If it is, that font is used for printed output. An initial bug with this new printing feature caused printed text to be improperly clipped in some font sizes. This has been fixed in this release.
