PowerBook 160, 180: System Enablers on Install Me First (3/93)

TOPIC -----

Our Install Me First Disk has Enabler 111 version 1.0.1. I placed version 1.0.2 of Enabler 111 on our working copy of the Disk Tools Disk for the PowerBook 160 and 180.

I tried replacing the enabler with version 1.0.2 on this Install Me First floppy disk; clearly the Installer doesn't want this and no longer recognizes the disk as the correct one. This is true even replacing the enabler with the original one.

I did a regular install to a PowerBook 180 with copies of original disks. Then, I booted with a Disk Tools Disk and dragged version 1.0.2 of the enabler onto the PowerBook hard disk. When I restart, I get an error.

Is there any way to update our Install Me First Disks so that we have the latest Enabler files?

DISCUSSION -----

Adding or removing files from Install Me First disks ISN'T recommended. The installer script often looks for specific file attributes besides filename, like version, modified date, and created date. If the installer script doesn't find exactly what it's looking for, it will abort.

System Enabler 111 version 1.0.2 is only required on PowerBook 160s and 180s with an Express Modem installed. The enabler is automatically installed when the Express Modem software 1.0.1 is installed.

System Enabler 111 version 1.0.2 will work on the PowerBook 160 and 180 without an Express Modem installed, so I suspect you may have downloaded the "corrupted" enabler that was posted on AppleLink. We replaced the corrupted enabler, and

you can download the enabler from AppleLink again.
