TOPIC -----

On a Macintosh Quadra 610 or 650 with 1MB video RAM (VRAM) and set to 32,000 colors, a horizontal white line appears just below halfway down the screen. This is a 14-inch color display, but the symptom occurs with different monitors.

DISCUSSION -----

Check the VRAM on these computers. The Macintosh Quadra 610 and 650 require VRAM with a speed of 80ns. 100ns VRAM -- such as that found in a Macintosh IIvx -- is not meant for use in these systems.
