TOPIC -----

Which monitors does the Macintosh LC III support at 640 by 400 pixels?

DISCUSSION -----

The Macintosh LC III can support the Apple 12-inch Monochrome Monitor, Macintosh 13-inch High-Resolution Monitor, and Macintosh 14-inch Color Display at 640 by 400 pixel resolution as well as at the standard 640 by 480 pixel resolution.

Here's how to select 640 by 400 pixel resolution:

- 1) Open the Control Panel and choose the Monitors option.
- 2) Hold down the Option key on the keyboard and choose the "Options..." selection in the Monitors dialog box.
- 3) 640 by 400 will appear as one of the choices under the Select Monitor Type dialog box. Choose 640 by 400 and click OK.

Your screen will now be set to 640 by 400 pixels resolution. To deselect this option, follow the same steps and choose a different option in the Select Monitor Type dialog box.
