"/usr/lib/send	ne line for "define(DOMAIN, 'DDaux.apple.com')" does not exist in mail.conf/cf/aux.mc". A/UX 3.1 has the line aux)dnl". The word "DOMAIN" is a pre-defined Macro in A/UX 3.1.
A/UX v3.0. With	a pre-defined Macro for "define(DOMAIN, 'DDaux.apple.com')" in A/UX 3.1, we add the "domain" subdirectory right below mail.conf" directory hierarchy.

Users should modify the "/usr/lib/sendmail.conf/domain/apple-aux.m4" file, more
